
Fewer, but more violent, protests in 2017 Civic Protest Barometer 2018

South Africa's leading monitor of civic protests

The Civic Protest Barometer (CPB) tracks <u>civic protests</u> across South Africa, which are a specific form of protest, directed at municipalities.

While nationally the number of civic protests in 2017 reached the lowest level in three years (CPB 2018 Fact Sheet #1 (no. of protests), the majority of civic protests can be classified as violent protests.

The Barometer shows

- After 2013 90% of protests have involved some element of violence.
- This is a significant increase in the presence of violence compared to 2007 (41%).
- Intimidation accounts for over one-third (35%) of all references to violence.
- Almost two-thirds of the types of violence recorded at protests went beyond intimidation and involved assault, looting, destruction of property and even death.

The 2018 edition of the Civic Protest Barometer (CPB) will be published in February with further detailed analysis of these and other findings.
