- Clicking on the Tenders tab leads to three sub-tabs: Registration of Suppliers (Vendors);
 Quotations and Tenders.
- Further clicking on the Tenders sub-tab leads to:
 - Archived Tenders
 - BAC Committee
 - Bid Register
 - Cancelled Tenders
 - o Tenders Awarded
 - Tender Results
 - Tender Notices
- The level of functionality of the above sub-tabs differs. For instance, the Archived Tenders tab is empty, there are no archives. However, archives are accessible by clicking on the Tender Notices sub-tab. Archives are for the period 2011-2019.

• Whilst the Tender Notices sub-tab provides for active tenders, it is not clear where the rest of 2020, non-active tenders are situated, as they are not provided for under archives.

2. Does the municipality publish tender notices?

- a. Yes, the municipality publishes tender notices and the list of tender notices seems complete.
- b. Yes, the municipality publishes tender notices but the list of tender notices has obvious gaps or the list seems incomplete.
- c. No, there are no tender notices on the municipality's website.

Comments:

- As at 29 October 2020, the municipal website provides for active tender notices under the tab Tenders.
- There are two active tender notices: Notice 4 of 2020/21 (dated 28 September 2020) and Notice 5 of 2020/21 (dated 9 October 2020).
- The closing dates for the active tenders (as at 29 October 2020) range from 30 October 2020
 17 November 2020.
- Based on the referencing/numbering of tender notices (e.g. Notice 4 of 2020/21), the location of previous notices in 2020 (e.g. No. 1, 2 & 3) could not be established on the municipal website.
- Active tenders are separated into the categories 80/20 and 90/10 preference point system.
- Active tenders are described according to these themes below. Important to note is that the
 description below is as far as the website provides. The municipality's own website does not
 provide for tender specifications and/or terms of reference. Instead, the website directs
 users to the e-tender portal for further information, and actually provides the link to etender.

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3. Does the municipality publish tender specifications for tender notices on its website, can they be downloaded free of charge?

- a. Yes, the municipality publishes tender specifications on its website, which are downloadable free of charge.
- b. Yes, the municipality publishes tender specifications, which are downloadable free of charge but only for some tender notices or the municipality publishes tender specifications but it imposes a cost to access the specifications.
- c. No, the municipality does not publish tender specifications.

Comments:

As projected in question 2, this is the only information listed under each tender:
 Tender number; Reference number; description, closing date; pre-qualification or special conditions; briefing session date if applicable; threshold; advert period and contact details.

- Whilst no tender specifications could be found on the municipal website, leading one to conclude that 'no, the municipality does not publish tender specifications' the following must be noted:
 - The municipal website directs users to the e-tender portal for further information.
 - The municipal website specifically states:
 Please note that the document for the tender below can be downloaded from the National Treasury website (www.etenders.gov.za).
 - The municipal website also states:

Tender documents are usually available free of charge on this website and can also be purchased during normal office hours (Monday to Friday from 07:45 till 15:15) at a non refundable deposit of R500-00 (VAT inclusive) at the Procurement Advice Centre....Tenders that are not available on the Internet must be purchased during normal office hours ...at a non refundable deposit of R750-00 (VAT inclusive) at the Procurement Advice Centre...

- It appears therefore that whilst no tender specifications could be found on the municipal website directly, they can be found on the National Treasury e-portal, the link of which the municipality provides on its website.
- From the above quoted statement, it also seems that the public has a choice of buying the information (which is readily available on the e-portal) at R500. For information that is not available at all (even on e-portal), the charge is R750.
- The e-tender portal was tested to examine whether it does indeed provide tender specifications as the municipal website directs.
- **Annexure 1** confirms that as directed by the municipal website, the e-tender portal does provide tender documentation.
- For the above reasons, even though the national treasury ePortal (which the municipality depends on for tender specifications) only reflects active tenders (and does not cover September 2019 August 2020, the review period), the municipality is rated 'b'.
- 4. Does the municipality publish the name of companies or individuals who win tenders on its website? Does it do so on time (i.e. within five working days after the award)?
 - a. Yes, the municipality publishes information about who wins tenders within five working days.
 - b. Yes, the municipality publishes information about who wins tenders but after five working days or the list of names of companies or individuals who won the tender has obvious gaps or seems incomplete.
 - c. No, the municipality does not publish information about who wins tenders.

- The municipality publishes the names of companies. However, the first obvious gap is that as at 30 October 2020, information available on the municipal website on tenders awarded was last updated on 30 June 2020. In other words, there is no information on tenders awarded in July, August and September 2020.
- The conclusion therefore is that the names of companies are not published within five working days, but possibly quarterly.
- In addition, for the period under review, (August 2019 September 2020), the municipality was inconsistent in its advertisement of tenders awarded. Notwithstanding the holiday period in SA, and the impact of COVID-19, there appears to be no tender awards published for the months December 2019 May 2020. **See Annex 2**.

5. Do tender specifications remain accessible on the website after the contract has been awarded for the duration of the contract?

- a. Yes, the tender specifications remain accessible on the website after the contract has been awarded for the duration of the contract.
- b. Yes, the tender specifications remain accessible on the website after the contract has been awarded but not for the entire duration of the contract or not all tender specification information remains accessible on the website for the entire duration of the relevant contracts.
- c. No, the tender specifications are removed after the award of the contract or the municipality does not publish tender specifications.

- This means that for tenders awarded between August 2019 and July 2020, there are currently no tender specifications on the website.


• The municipality only publishes the tender number, description, department, date awarded and appointed tenderer, as shown below and also in Annex 3.

 It appears that this has been the practice in the municipality for many years, based on the fact that reviews of random publications of awarded tenders all reveal that the price is not advertised.

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• The eTender portal provides the name and price. However, its list seems limited, given that as at 30 October, only one awarded bid appeared on the website.


Comments:

The municipality relies on the e-tender portal for tender specifications / tender documentation. Information such as tender number, closing date etc all correspond.

General assessment:

- a) What is your overall impression on how easy it is to navigate the municipal website to find procurement information? Rate out of 10?
 - The website is well-structured and easy to navigate. However, the municipality could streamline its adverts on active tenders better, as explained in (b) below.
- b) Any tips on how the municipality could improve citizens' access to procurement information on its website?
 - As at 30 October 2020, the information on active tenders is available on the tenders landing page, and further, under tender notices. But the information is presented differently, in tabular format and in narrative format (See Annex 1). The table format indicates tender specifications can be obtained on the e-tender portal. The narrative format indicates tender specifications are not available on the internet.
 - Triangulating information presented on the municipal website and on the e-tender portal was painstaking. Given that the municipality already relies on the e-portal for advertising tender specifications, it would do well to integrate all the information. In other words, simply provide the name of the tender and due date on its own website, and then direct users to the e-portal for everything else.

- c) Are there any best practices in the municipality which can be shared with other municipalities?
 - The municipality compiles a bid-register for tenders received. eg. http://www.tshwane.gov.za/sites/business/Tenders/Tender%20Submission%20List/HD%20 02%20-%2020.20.pdf . This way, suppliers are assured that their tenders do not disappear in the system. They are captured, and receive a fair chance of being evaluated alongside other competing bids.
- d) Are there any other issues that caught your attention when undertaking the assessment?
 - The municipality can do better in terms of quality assurance, regarding information made available to the public. For instance, under awarded tenders, it has a document with tracked changes. Such should never appear on an organisation website. It leads to the assumption that the municipality just dumps information on the website, with no quality control.


