The Truth and Reconciliation Process:

...provides a historic bridge between the past of a deeply divided society characterized by strife, conflict, untold suffering and injustice, and a future founded on the recognition of human rights, democracy and peaceful coexistence for all South Africans, irrespective of colour, race, class, belief or sex;

AND SINCE it is deemed necessary to establish the truth in relation to past events as well as the motives for and circumstances in which gross violations of human fights have occurred, and to make the findings known in order to prevent a repetition of such acts in future;

AND SINCE the Constitution states that the pursuit of national unity, the wellbeing of all South African citizens and peace require reconciliation between the people of South Africa and the reconstruction of society;

AND SINCE the Constitution states that there is a need for understanding but not for vengeance, a need for reparation but not for retaliation, **a need for ubuntu but not for victimization**:

Active Listening



James O'Dea's Seven Ways of Listening

Transactional Listening -discrete issue and specific answer to question;

Cognitive-Process Listening - unraveling complex entanglement of head and heart and listening for the fix;

Emotional Outcome Listening - addresses the emotional subtext of the interaction - Is the person waiting for the desired or feared response so it can block possible outcomes?

Postural listening - Debating mode where you want to impress and not lose a particular point; Persuasion is the goal?

Inquiry listening - Emphasis is discovery through deep questions so truth can be revealed; fresh insights and new ideas can enhance the quality of engagement

Heart-centered listening - Create a space where people can feel safe to tell their story and express feelings and you listen in the spirit of non-judgment

Integral listening - Sync of body, mind and heart - detached but not disengaged; listens to content, uses insightful silence and makes ones whole being feel seen and heard.



LIVING TRADITIONAL JUSTICE

Navajo peacemaking is one of the most renowned restorative justice programs in the world. Neither mediation nor alternative dispute resolution, it has been called a "horizontal system of justice" because all participants are treated as equals with the purpose of preserving ongoing relationships and restoring harmony among involved parties. In peacemaking there is no coercion, and there are no "sides." No one is labeled the offender or the victim, the plaintiff or the defendant.
